### From the Kickapoo QRP Operating Desk

The first thing is to learn to take advantage of any new pieces of ham radio gear that Santa may have left under the tree for you. Hopefully you were on his "Nice list" and received something. If not, not to fret as there is an abundance of ham radio gear still in the stores and at the coming hamfests this year. Personally, I ended up with a new Yaesu HF transceiver and am enjoying the nice features it has to offer, but at the same time learning how to best make use of some of those features.

The next operating event will be the "19<sup>th</sup> annual Freeze Your Keys" winter operating event held at the shelter house in Weston Bend State Park. That event is scheduled for February 25<sup>th</sup> and hopefully the weather will be good for that day. We'll start setting up as soon as the park gate opens, which is usually at 7:00 and hopefully we'll be on the air by 08:00 as that's what we advertise in QST and other publications. The building project this time will be the 40/20 meter trap dipole kit from Pacific Antenna. This kit is sold by "qrpkits" and I have used one now for several years with very good results. This is a very good antenna for portable use like SOTA or POTA and easy to repair if something should break. They also sell a 17/30 meter version of this antenna. 

To acquire that 10-digit number you can either find "How to Register for your FRN" through Ham Radio Prep or visit the following link: <a href="https://apps.fcc.gov/coresWeb/publicHome.do">https://apps.fcc.gov/coresWeb/publicHome.do</a> and select register, individual and continue to fill out the form. You will receive your FRN number as soon as the form is submitted. That number will be used for all communications with the FCC. Save it!!
